Relax on holiday knowing your property is secure!

With the warmer weather often comes an increase in burglary figures with opportunists taking advantage of open doors and windows or people away on holiday. With this in mind we attempt to help you to make the most of the summer months, without the stress of burglaries.

National Rural Crime Survey

The National Rural Crime Network has recently carried out the biggest ever survey of rural policing and crime. The aim of the survey is to use the results to improve awareness of crime in rural areas, encourage crime prevention, inform government policy and help ensure funding is not lost.

The survey concluded at the end of June and the results were announced on BBC1's Country File on 19 July. The full results will be made available later in the year, to find out more visit: www.nationalruralcrimenetwork.net

85% of our county, Hampshire, is classed as rural. According to insurance firm NFU Mutual's annual claims data, the cost to the UK economy in 2014 was £37.8 million; down 15 per cent on the previous year.

Between 2012 and 2014 the Home Office has carried out an annual Commercial Victimisation Survey, which looks at crimes against businesses in England and Wales. The results of the 2014 survey were released earlier this year and show that the overall crime rate against businesses premises has fallen between 2012 and 2014.

However findings did reveal that antisocial behaviour against businesses has remained steady over the three years. Respondents felt that this type of activity would have a perceived impact on custom and financially on the business.

Youngsters 'hanging around', trespass or use of vehicles on property were some of the most frequently reported problems.
